ITEMS NEEDED and HOW THEY WILL BE USED

Bibles, tracts, devotional literature, Sunday School materials will be sent to pastors and individuals for use in South American countries.

T-shirts in any size or color will be transformed into diapers and sanitary kits.

Pillowcases will be made into dresses and sent to Africa.

Soap, shampoo, conditioners, lotions (partial bottles welcomed) will be given to House of Hope.

Paper towels, baby wipes, baby books, soap, sleepers, gift cards will be taken to Alternatives Pregnancy Center.

Cancelled stamps - simply tear off the upper right corner of the envelope and volunteers at Alliance Stamp Ministry will trim and distribute.

Old towels, rugs, bedspreads, pet beds, old pillows will be taken to the Cedar Bend Humane Society.

Dog and cat food (even if expired), freezer-burned meats, AND empty buckets will be given to Black Hawk Wildlife Rehabilitation.

New and used sheets, yarn, thread will be given to OHC Quilting Ministry.

New stuffed animals, Beanie Babies will be provided to Samaritan's Purse Shoebox Ministry.
