- 3. **Watch Alice's teaching 5:28- 6:56** how does Alice's reminder not to divide the Trinity help you understand what happened on the cross?
- 4. How do you react to the statement, "The cross is the center of our faith."
- 5. Watch Alice's teaching 6:57-10:09. Have you ever thought of sin as both Sin a destructive power and sin the symptoms of that power, the misdeeds in our own life? What do you think of this concept? How do you see both Sin and sins at work in your life?
- 6. **Watch Alice's teaching 10:09 11:25** Why do you think word pictures or metaphors are sometimes more "true" than a bullet-point listing of facts?
- 7. Watch Alice's teaching 14:09 Does the ransom metaphor of what happened on the cross make sense to you? How is it the same or different from what you already thought about the cross? Why or why not? Have someone read 1 Peter 18-19.
- 8. **Have someone read Mark 10:45**. What does it look like to give your allegiance to God who paid your ransom, who opened the door to your prison cell?
