## Three Actions Steps for living with Tension

- 4. Be WITH people
  - a. Is there a better way to be with people in tension than to serve that person?
  - b. Why is it so hard to serve people you disagree with, that you might not really like?
- 5. Accept others
  - a. Can you think of a time you accepted someone with whom you experienced a lot of tension?
  - b. Did you enter their world even when you couldn't embrace their way of life?
  - c. How do you choose to be loving instead of judging?
  - d. Do you agree that loving captures hearts where judging cannot?
  - e. Has someone done this for you?

## 6. Be a learner-

- a. Talk about something you have tried to experience from another persons' point of view.
- b. How have you been able to develop empathy for others in the past?
- c. What is required for you to learn something new? How open on a scale of 1 to 10 are you to learning something new right now?
- d. **Jeff challenged us with the following two statements.** 1 Cor. 8:1 "We all possess knowledge." But knowledge puffs up while love builds up." AND "It's more important to make a connection than to make a point." How do you internalize these two statements? Why does it matter?
